## **SUMMARY OF APRIL MEETING**

### **04/04/2023 Committee Meeting**

- **LPS hearing**

The tCA submission had its hearing on 04/04/23. The submission was about:

- 1) Keeping open the possibility of an eventual town bypass with a specific area plan (SAP) on lands along Agnes Rivulet.
- 2) A SAP on the Old School Farm, to ensure that any development recognises and acknowledges the site's heritage values and the important cultural role the Old School Farm and the former Council Depot site has played in the broader Cygnet community and must demonstrate a clear social and community benefit.

- **Cygnet Town Hall**

An idea was put in to the committee on the possibility of clear roofing the lane along the Town Hall, to make it more usable during events, markets, etc. The committee discussed this and concluded that more urgent is the maintenance work that needs to be done on the Town Hall (heating, cracks, lighting, etc.). This will be discussed with the GM at the May special meeting.

- **Widening Lymington Road**

Again we discussed the need for widening Lymington Road between the Burtons Reserve footbridge and the Cannery (approx. 400metres) to make it safer for traffic and pedestrians. A petition will be started to ask Council to put pressure on State Roads to do it.

- **Anchor display**

The Cygnet Living History Museum was asked to find a suitable location for four ancient anchors from Basil Smee's estate. One suggestion is to display them on the walk along Lymington Road.

- **May meetings**

There will be a special meeting with the General Manager. The agenda was discussed.
