## **SUMMARY OF APRIL MEETINGS**

### **09/04/2024 Special Meeting with HVC CEO Lachlan Kranz**

These points were discussed:

- ***Update on State Govt grant for new road / Mary street safety***  
Nothing has been decided yet, and there will be community consultation before anything is decided. Meanwhile, State Roads is looking at reducing the speed limit on Mary Street, and then installing a wombat crossing in front of the Town Hall.
- ***LUDS (Land Use and Development Strategy)***  
Cygnet township plan is being developed. The heritage component is nearly done, and the township plan will be up for public consultation in the coming financial year. There is still a lot of work to do.
- ***CCTV cameras and lights in parks and other dark places***  
A CCTV project will be presented for consideration in the 24/25 budget.
- ***Cygnet playground equipment renewal***  
Option 2 was the preferred option at the public consultation. Comments and further suggestions are always welcome.
- ***Planting on verges***  
HVC draft ‘Street Tree and Vegetation Policy’ (based on Hobart policy) will be ready this week, and feedback will be sought.
- ***Cygnet Town Hall management***  
Council’s favoured model would be for a not-for-profit community group to manage the Town Hall. Council will invite Cygnet community groups to discuss this.

### **09/04/2024 Committee Meeting**

- ***Taswater projects***  
Taswater came to discuss the project in Burtons Reserve to upgrade stormwater management. They will advise the public of what’s happening.
- ***tCA website***  
A refreshed website will be launched soon.
- ***FoGo (Food Organics Garden Organics) bins***  
A pilot project is being developed in Cygnet.
